PUT "ICE" IN YOUR CELL PHONE

Please take a minute to read this. This is a good idea, especially if you travel a lot.

I had always wondered myself, how would anyone know who to call for you in an emergency. I also came across this problem when I witnessed an accident several years ago and the woman was half out of it and trouble telling me who to call for her. I think it is a great idea.

PUT "ICE" IN YOUR CELL PHONE.

A recent article from the Toronto Star, "the ICE idea," is catching on and it is a very simple, yet important method of contact for you or a loved one in case of an emergency.

As cell phones are carried by the majority of the population, all you need to do is program the number of a contact person or persons and store the name as "ICE."

The idea was thought up by a paramedic who found that when they went to the scenes of accidents, there were always mobile phones with patients, but they didn't know which numbers to call. He therefore thought that it would be a good idea if there was a nationally recognized name to file "next of kin" under.

Following a disaster in London The East Anglian Ambulance Service has launched a national "In case of Emergency (ICE)" campaign. The idea is that you store the word "ICE" in your mobile phone address book, and with it enter the number of the person you would want to be contacted "In Case of Emergency ." In an emergency situation, Emergency Services personnel and hospital staff would then be able to quickly find the contact information under "ICE."

It really could save your life, or put a loved one's mind at rest. For more than one contact name simply enter ICE 1, ICE 2, ICE 3, etc. A great idea that could make a difference!
