*We all know Vanna White from Wheel of fortune, but as many of you know, she is also an avid crocheter who has her own line of yarn.*

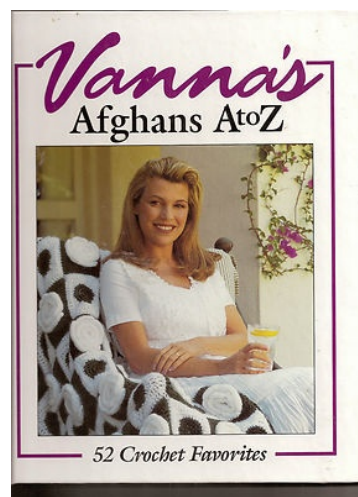

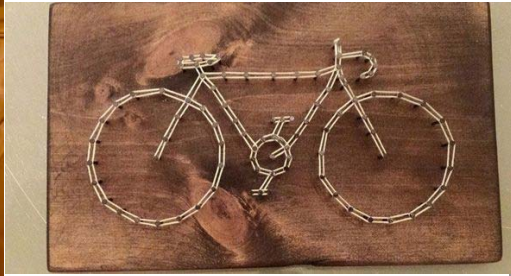
