| 1 10oz. Angel Food Cake | 1 cup commercial sour cream |
| 1 small pkg. Instant Vanilla pudding | 1 can cherry pie filling |
| 1 ½ cups milk | |

Cut or tear cake into ½ inch cubes. Put into large mixing bowl. Set aside. In another bowl add pudding mix, milk and sour cream. Beat with mixer on low until mixed and starting to thicken. Fold into the cake. Place in a 10 1/2 to 8 x2 pan. Cover with cherry pie filling. Chill well.
