Here's a recipe from one of my coworkers that she entered in a cookie contest we held here at work:

### Caramel Apple Pie Cookies

#### Ingredients

- 1 Box of ready made refrigerated Pillsbury Pie Crust (2 sheets per box)
- Approx.. 1 Can of Apple Pie Filling
- Approx. 1 Cup of Caramel Sauce (use just enough to cover the dough)
- 1 Egg for the egg-wash
- 2 Tbsp. Cinnamon Sugar
- 1 Tbsp. Nutmeg
- Flour just for sprinkling



#### Instructions

1. Unroll one of the pie crusts and lay it out on your surface.
2. Spread the Caramel Sauce over the pie crust leaving about 1/8" of an edge
3. Coarsely chop the apples in the pie filling, then spread on top of the caramel sauce.
4. Unroll the 2nd pie crust and cut into strips. I used a wavy edged pastry cutter.
5. Layer the pie crust strips over the apple filling in a lattice formation.
6. Taking a round cookie cutter, cut your cookies and lay on your cookie sheet
7. Beat your egg and with a pastry brush then brush the egg over the top of the lattice pastry strips.
8. Sprinkle with cinnamon sugar and some nutmeg.
9. Bake at 350 degrees for 20-25 or until golden brown.

These are best eaten the same day. The crust absorbs moisture from the filling and they get soft.

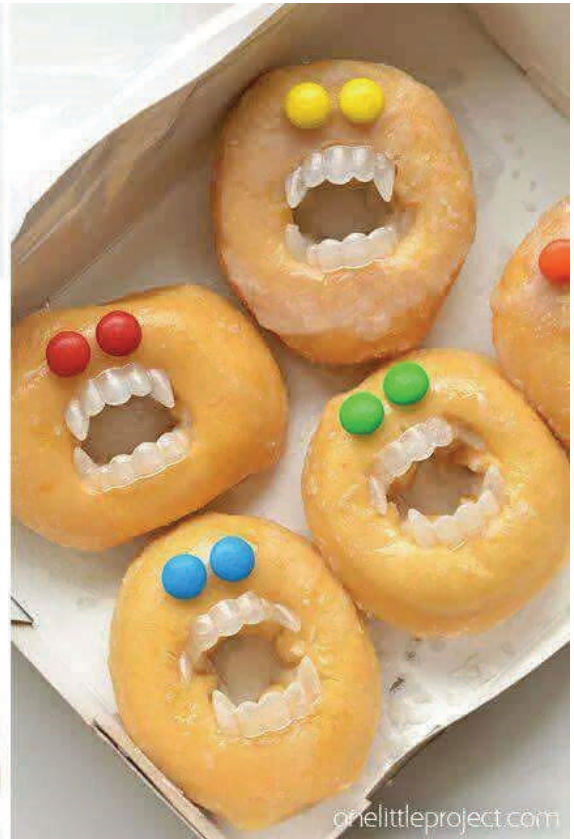
